Education News

After-School Learning

Norwich Museums have been working with schools in the Norwich area to provide after-school learning opportunities.

'Top it all off!': An After-School Hats Project

We are now working with schools in the Norwich area to provide out of school hours projects. During the autumn term we ran a 5-week project with 15 young people from West Earlham Middle School. Using hats from our collections the pupils researched, designed and made their own hats. They then put together an end-of-course hat parade to which parents and teachers were invited.

In the Spring term we are working with Hellesdon High School on an after-school project looking at work in the past and the present using collections from the Bridewell Museum and the Norwich Union. The pupils will construct a website which will explore how current career options in present-day Norwich have been influenced by the past.

'Cornelia Parker: Installations' 22nd November 2004 - 27th February 2005

The new Tate Show is now open at Norwich Castle Museum. Two installations by Cornelia Parker 'Cold Dark Matter' (sometimes called the 'Exploding Shed') and 'Thirty Pieces of Silver'
