



Tate Exhibition at Norwich Castle

November 2004 - February 2005 Teachers Preview 23rd November 4.00-5.30

Norwich Castle's new show from the Tate will focus on the artist, Cornelia Parker and her exciting 3-D work 'Cold dark matter', often called the 'Exploding shed'. Parker filled a garden shed with objects and then had the British Army explode it. The fragments from this explosion are suspended, capturing the point of explosion.

There will be a supporting programme of events - including a teachers' preview (see above), schools workshops, 'A' level master classes and education-led gallery sessions. Full programme to be confirmed.

New Anglo-Saxon and Viking Gallery at Norwich Castle Museum & Art Gallery

Norwich Castle Museum's new gallery on the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings opened on July 6th.

The gallery tells the story of the arrival of the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings in the East of England. It chronicles their lives and how we all feel there continued presence both in Norfolk and in the rest of the country.

It is an ideal way for Key Stage 2 pupils to learn more about the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings as 'invaders and settlers'.

There is a teacher's pack to accompany the exhibition which is being sent free to every school. This contains both activities and information for both the classroom and in the museum itself.
