Welcome to Norfolk Children's Services Study Support and Playing for Success newsletter: this is intended to be a termly edition which highlights good practice, offers advice and news about Out of School Hours Learning across Norfolk.

Study Support is learning activity outside normal lessons which young people take part in voluntarily. Study Support is, accordingly, an inclusive term, embracing many activities, with many names and guises. Its purpose is to improve young people's motivation, build their self-esteem and help them become more effective learners. Above all it aims to raise achievement.

Extending Opportunity: a national framework for Study Support, DfEE 1998

This is still the most often quoted definition of Study Support and sums up neatly its purpose.

Study Support and PfS have recently undergone a re-structure in Norfolk and now sits in the Community Learning & Development Service alongside other services such as Youth Strategy, Music, Sport, Environmental Education, Outdoor Education, Field Centres and Arts Development. This has enabled Study Support to have a direct impact on planning in the new Children's Services Service Plan.

This first newsletter is designed to inform schools of our service aims as well as introducing Study Support personnel. There is also a retrospective view of the various PfS activities currently operating in the county.

The Study Support Service aims to:

- Encourage extended learning and tuition
- Engage young people in their learning
- Offer advice and training opportunities relating to Study Support
- Encourage schools to quality assure their Study Support programmes
- Enable young people to participate and contribute to their schools and wider community
- Provide high quality Playing for Success initiatives
- Share good practice through newsletter and websites
- Access University of the First Age activities and benefits

Playing for Success

The initiative is a partnership between DfES, Local Authorities and local sports clubs. The Centres use the environment of and medium of sport as motivational tools to raise standards of Literacy, Numeracy and ICT.

Playing for Success (PfS) has been operating in Norfolk since 1999 when the Norwich City Football Club Study Centre was opened. The centre has since moved to purpose built facilities at Carrow Road and offers a huge range of Study Support activities to local schools. The PfS 'family' in Norfolk now boasts the King's Lynn Stars Study Centre, the Viking Learning Centre at North Walsham Rugby Football Club and PfS programmes at all 6 Norfolk Specialist Sports Colleges. Future developments include PfS at Sedgeford Premier Racquets and Fitness and a KS2 satellite initiative at a Norwich Middle School.
