Abortion: Whose Choice?

Aim

- To raise awareness and understanding about teenage pregnancy and abortion in order to enable professionals to facilitate constructive discussion of the issues and equip young people to make informed choices.
- To enable practitioners to provide clear information and supportive advice about abortion to young people.

Aim

To explore ways of supporting young people to delay first sex.

Learning Outcomes

Participants will:

- Have an opportunity to look at the causes and effects of early sex and become familiar with some of the current research findings on these issues
- Explore a range of ways to work with young people to help them make positive and healthy decisions for themselves
- Develop an understanding of the role pressure plays in young people having early sex
- Gain some skills in saying 'no' and resisting pressure to hand on to young people
- Discuss alternatives to having sex
- Take an opportunity to consider the roles of friends and supportive adults in young people delaying first sex
- Share methodologies and plan ways in which to implement the course learning in practice and how to present and develop this work with young people

Norfolk Drug and Alcohol Action Team **Training 2006 – 2007**

Norfolk Drug and Alcohol Action team (DAAT) run a full training programme based in locations around the county. To deliver these courses the DAAT draws upon a number of training providers and also draws upon local treatment providers to share their knowledge with participants. Without the help of these people the DAAT would not be able to deliver the varied calendar of training events for both specialist and generic non-specialist services.

The DAAT use a three level framework for training, Foundation, Intermediary and Specialist. This will continue in 2006 with well-established courses like the one-day **Foundation drug and alcohol awareness**, the two-day **Screening and Effective Interventions**, the three-day **Crack Cocaine** course and more recent additions like the half-day **Overdose Awareness** training and the two-day **Foster Carers** course run in conjunction with Social Services.

Drugs, Alcohol and Reproductive Health Conference

The yearly Drugs, Alcohol and Reproductive Health Conference returns on 8th June and as with previous years, we hope to be able to draw speakers both from here in Norfolk and from around the country. The event will be held at the Norfolk and Norwich hospital.

Certificate in Higher Education (Substance Misuse)

For the last three years the DAAT have been working with the UEA School of Nursing and Midwifery, to develop an accredited course. Part one of this Certificate level course has been running for two years now, but this year the DAAT are pleased to announce that our Part two proposal for the course has been accepted and we are now able to offer a full academic award, a two-year Certificate in Higher Education (Substance Misuse).



Using A47 Bypass:

- Follow A47 Bypass towards Great Yarmouth
- Take the Thorpe St. Andrew & Postwick exit off the A47 Bypass
- Follow the road under an arched railway bridge to another roundabout – turn right into St. Andrew's Business Park
- Follow the road up to a small roundabout and turn right, following the visitors sign to the main entrance of St. Andrew's House. You can park on the road leading to the main entrance

Coming from Norwich:

- Follow the A1042 towards Great Yarmouth
- At the roundabout intersection at Pound Lane proceed straight ahead and under the arched railway bridge

At the next roundabout, turn left, follow the road up to a small roundabout and turn right, following the visitors sign to the main entrance of St. Andrews' House. You can park on the road leading to the main entrance.
