BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE ON BOOKINGS

This year's training and development programme continues to provide a range of opportunities both for Newly Qualified Teachers (NQTs) and their Induction Tutors. The central training programme builds on the evaluations and findings from last year's courses. It also takes particular account of the rewritten DfES guidance, the new Career Entry and Development Profile (CEDP), and the revised Induction Standards which take effect from September 2003.

When booking places on the NQT courses there are a number of points it might be helpful to bear in mind:

- Bookings for courses should be negotiated and planned between the NQT and Induction Tutor, based on the NQT's identified needs and priorities
- Please note than some of our courses take place early in the Autumn term and places for these will need to be booked in good time. These courses are scheduled early in response to what NQTs say they feel they need at the start of their Induction Period.
- Some of our Norwich-based courses quickly become over-subscribed. In order to help secure a place and to avoid unnecessary disappointment, please book on-line through Norfolk Esinet or http://advisoryservice.norfolk.gov.uk/inset or try to send in booking forms as early as possible, once the professional development needs of individual NQTs have been jointly identified and relevant course(s) have been found. You may also wish to consider the alternative venue of Kings Lynn, where many of the training sessions are also offered.
- It is our policy to provide written confirmation of each booking made, in advance of the event. This is done for each individual activity. If you have not received such confirmation within two weeks of the event, please contact Kim Ward or Karen Floyd to check that we have received and processed your booking form.

Training opportunities for Newly Qualified Teachers

Our central training programme is mostly phase-related, but focuses on the more generic professional development needs of NQTs. These courses are intended to help support and contribute to individuals' induction programmes which are drawn up in negotiation with their Induction Tutors.

The Advisory Service, as well as other training providers, offers a range of courses which are not specific to NQTs, but which may be relevant to the professional development needs of individual NQTs and to their induction objectives. Details of these courses can be found in the INSET Opportunities folders and other documents in your school, and on our website. (www.norfolkesinet.org.uk.)

Since the vast majority of NQTs take up their posts in September and January, the main schedule of courses runs across the Autumn and Spring terms, to reflect the needs of NQTs in the earlier stages of their Induction Period. However, additional courses are also offered in the Summer Term to reflect the interests of NQTs as they begin to consider the next stage of their career. For example, we offer a course to primary NQTs on 'Preparing to become a subject leader' and repeat a course to secondary NQTs on 'The Effective Form Tutor'.

Details of other professional development opportunities for NQTs, such as the Leading Maths Teachers schemes can be found in the LEA Induction Support Pack.

'Welcome to Induction' sessions

We are particularly keen to encourage Induction Tutors and NQTs to attend a welcome meeting/briefing session together early on in the Induction Period. This also provides an opportunity to meet colleagues from other schools who are involved in Induction. These 'Welcome to Induction' events are offered in a number of locations, to enable NQTs and Induction Tutors to create local networks and contacts. There is no charge for attending the sessions and refreshments are provided. Please use the normal booking form to request a place. *Please note that joint attendance by the NQT and Induction Tutor is expected at these sessions*.

Training opportunities for Induction Tutors and Induction Managers

We continue to offer courses to support key Induction staff. These aim to cater for colleagues who are new to Induction, as well as for those who already have experience in this area, but who wish to update their knowledge and skills, particularly in the light of this year's revised Induction documents and national Induction Standards.

Most of these courses are repeated each term to help meet the needs of those who take on the new roles during the course of the year, and also to reflect the fact that not all NQTs begin their Induction at the start of the Autumn Term. The first of these courses takes place in July 2003, although there are also briefing sessions arranged for the end of June and beginning of July on the various revisions and changes.

School-based support

Schools, or clusters of schools, may wish to consider arranging school-based support or training for their Induction Tutor(s) and/or NQTs. This can provide a cost-effective alternative where there are several NQTs and Induction Tutors in the same school, for example.

Further information and guidance on providing effective Induction for NQTs can be found in our NQT Induction Support Packs. These are sent to Headteachers, Induction Tutors and Newly Qualified Teachers once a school registers their NQT(s) with the Advisory Service.
