

Once considered to be a rebel, now a local hero, Robert Kett is an example of a Norfolk man who achieved national fame. His story asks questions about what fame means and how attitudes change: hanged as a rebel in 1549, he is now regarded by many as a true 'working class hero'. This pack uses contemporary documents to look at Kett, and his rebellion, and at attitudes to him across the centuries. The pack includes a CD containing readings from the documents and a piece of Tudor music.
