Youth and Community

I hope you will find this year's Youth and Community Service handbook/diary informative and helpful in your support of work with young people in Norfolk.

Included is information relating to the wide range of partners with whom the Service works and some of the projects that have evolved from those partnerships.

This year will see the Connexions Service "going live" in Norfolk. This significant new service offering information, advice and support to young people is working in close partnership with this service, and youth workers are playing a key role in its development.

Over the past year the government has demonstrated support to youth work through the "Transforming Youth Work Programme", contributing additional funding into local provision with a particular focus on support and closer liaison with the voluntary sector.

Both the significance and effectiveness of the Youth Service in Norfolk was acknowledged by OFSTED in the report on the Inspection of the Local Education Authority published last September.

The work of this service continues to develop with projects offering a range of support to communities making provision for local young people, youth projects and youth clubs. Alongside this, the service delivers specific programmes focused on those young people who need additional support at school, in work/training or in their personal lives.

This Service will, with partners, continue to offer high quality learning opportunities for young people in Norfolk.

Service Plan, April 2002 – March 2003

Norfolk Youth and Community Service is part of Norfolk County Council Education Department. The aims and objectives of the Service reflect those of the Education Department and link directly with the Norfolk County Council Performance Plan.

The Service Plan describes the key aims and outcomes for the Service for the period April 2002 to March 2003. These aims and outcomes are interpreted into individual district/project/training plans that specify the work that will be undertaken during this period.

The Service Plan will be an integral element of the Connexions Service delivery in Norfolk.

Statement of Purpose

Norfolk Youth and Community Service works with young people during their adolescence with a priority for those between 13-19, enabling them to achieve their potential. make informed decisions participate in society. Youth work engages young people on a voluntary basis supporting them in their transition to adult life by enabling them to gain knowledge, develop skills and explore attitudes within a framework of equality. Youth work is based on young people's needs with emphasis tackling an disaffection and promoting social inclusion.

Key Service Aims

This year, the Youth and Community Service will work to four key service aims which are supported by 9 strategic objectives and specific service targets. The four key service aims are:

⇒ To promote <u>social inclusion</u> and <u>active citizenship</u> amongst young people.

- ⇒ To promote and support accessible <u>youth work</u> provision in <u>local communities</u> which is based on young people's <u>needs</u>.
- ⇒ To contribute towards more integrated services for young people, within a culture of working in partnership, in particular with the Norfolk Connexions Service.
- ⇒ To continuously <u>improve</u> the <u>quality</u> of youth work.

The Service will pursue the four key aims by means of the following 9 strategic objectives.

To contribute to alternative education projects for young people disengaged or at risk of disengagement from the school curriculum.

- ⇒ To offer diversionary and preventative youth work to young people who are at risk of offending/reoffending.
- ⇒ To promote active citizenship enabling young people to make a positive contribution to the community.
- ⇒ To provide accessible Information, Advice and Counselling Services to young people.
- ⇒ With local communities and other partners, to develop, support and deliver a range of 'open' youth work opportunities.
- ⇒ To provide additional opportunities for young people to extend their learning.
- ⇒ To develop and deliver a strategy to identify and make a youth work response to groups and individuals with particular needs.
- ⇒ To improve the performance management of all staff.
- ⇒ To continuously improve the quality of youth work and level of young people's achievement.

For each of these strategic objectives, specific targets have been defined. These targets will be interpreted into particular District/projects plans by the named postholder.

Norfolk County Active Citizenship Unit

The Norfolk County Active Citizenship Unit is an initiative developed by the Youth and Community Service to enable young people to have their views and concerns heard by decision-makers in Norfolk. It also enables those politicians, officers, and agencies to effectively consult with young people.

This is a direct response to modernising government initiatives and the introduction of Citizenship within the school curriculum. The aim is to increase young people's participation in democracy at local, national and international levels.

The Active Citizenship aims to bring young people and adults together to make a positive impact on community life by:

- Working to the Local Government Association/National Youth Agency Standards for the active involvement of young people in local democracy.
- * Supporting the adoption of the above Standards at District and County level by local authorities.
- * Providing an access route for Local Councils, Health and Police Authorities to consult with young people.
- * Working with Schools Councils to develop good practice and increase students participation in decision making.
- Bringing together young people to work on issues of common interest and concern.
- * Supporting Members of the UK Youth Parliament.
- * Developing a "Youth Bank", young people giving grants to other young people.
- Ensuring young people are actively involved in the operation and management of the Connexions Service

Off Centre Counselling


"Off Centre" is a free, open-ended counselling service for individual young people aged 11-25.

It is staffed by trained youth counsellors and is a partnership project between NYCS and MAP. All counsellors receive client supervision.

It is for young people across the county excluding the city of Norwich. (MAP offers counselling for Norwich young people.)

Any young person can ring **0800 917 5917** to refer themselves or simply find out about the service. Other family members or professionals are also welcome to ring with any enquiries. After the phone call, the young person is met for an initial informal assessment, then joins a waiting list for placing with a counsellor who

- (a) suits their needs
- (b) is local and can meet them where they live, or as near as possible.



Young people and their counsellors meet in all sorts of places – schools, NYCS buildings, surgeries, village halls, church rooms to name just a few!


We do refer to specialist services when necessary, and if counselling is not really what the young person wants, we offer information and advice and sign posting to where the necessary help is.

"Off Centre" is for young people only, not their families, but any worries or enquiries from families or carers will be dealt with sensitively and with the young person's interest uppermost.

Information and Advice

The Youth and Community Service provides young people with the information and advice that they need and request, on issues that are relevant to them. These include education, housing, employment, health and many more.

These services can be accessed through the districts or centrally. Trained workers respond to the individual needs of young people via various projects, face to face through high schools, mobile provision and other building based projects or over the phone.



All projects will respond to both the young people's requests and enquiries from other interested parties.

YCS Outdoor Education Programme

YCS Outdoor Education Programme provides exciting, person-centred learning opportunities, which enable young people to recognise their potential, to learn new skills and to take control of their learning environment. Outdoor Education is a valuable tool for re-engaging young people in the learning process, for building self esteem and developing co-operative group work strategies.

Programmes are designed and delivered to complement:

- * Projects supporting young people in school
- * Links 4 Projects and work with those not attending school
- Study Support Programmes
- Work with targeted groups of young people
- School holiday recreational and accredited courses

As a result of setting and achieving their own learning goals young people are able to develop confidence and self-esteem, identify and use problem solving techniques and to develop other key personal and social skills.





Connect Youth International Eastern Region

Connect Youth International was established to promote youth exchanges and to develop local training and advisory support. Members, who include representatives of LEAs, and voluntary youth organisations, make decisions on grants for youth and youth worker exchanges.

Grants for Youth Exchange

Connect Youth International (CYI) gives grants to British youth groups to help with the costs of travelling to other countries and hosting return visits to the United Kingdom. A youth group can have as few as 8 members (including leaders) or as many as 30, and may include young people aged between 15 and 25 years. An exchange should emphasise social contact and target a common interest or theme. It will aim to promote international friendship and understanding and to help the social / cultural growth of those taking part.

CYI receives applications for exchange grants from all over Europe and the USA, and submits recommendations and decisions directly to the Youth Exchange Centre for payment grants. Additional funds are available from the Youth for Europe programme of the European Community to support bilateral, trilateral and multinational projects with member states. Further information is available from CYI in London. Enquiries concerning applications for grants for exchanges with other countries should be made direct to CYI or to the Commonwealth Youth Exchange Council for exchanges with other Commonwealth member states.

Training for Youth Organisers

CYI works to raise the quality of youth exchanges through:

- giving advice on Advanced Planning Visits for group leaders where the exchange is new or difficult to organise
- organising study visits to partner countries for those wanting to start exchanges

- staging regional events to encourage new groups to take advantage of the benefits which result from international experience
- planning training programmes on the international dimension of working with young people.

Youth Work, Community Safety Strategies, Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnerships and the Norfolk Youth Offending Team

In line with the Crime and Disorder Act (1998), Youth Workers in Norfolk are contributing to the design and delivery of local community safety strategies through active involvement with Crime & Disorder Reduction Partnerships operating in each of the District Council areas and by working in partnership with the Youth Offending Team.

Youth workers are providing and supporting a range of projects as well as enabling access to specialist services such as counselling. Through their knowledge and understanding about young people, youth workers have an important role in delivering a range of preventative and diversionary work which helps to reduce youth offending and enable young people to contribute to Community Safety.

Youth Work and the Youth Offending Team

The multi-agency Youth Offending Team operates through 3 unit teams (West, East and Norwich) and includes staff from Youth Justice, Social Services, Health, Probation, Police and Education.

Youth workers are contributing directly and indirectly to the work of the Youth Offending Team whose duties include:

- Direct delivery of Youth Justice Services
- Bail Support Services including bail information and support to young people on remand
- Preparation of Court Reports
- Supervision of young people released from custody and those receiving court orders/community sentences
- Assessment and support for final warnings
- Work with victims



The Norfolk Education Advisory Service

The Norfolk Education Advisory Service provides high quality services to all Norfolk schools based on the priorities of the Education Development Plan. This accounts for just over half of the work the Service is engaged in and comprises activities paid for directly through specifications by the Director. Examples of this work include a link adviser for every school through the provision of the Review and Development Adviser system, additional support for schools in difficulty, support for head teacher appointments, support for schools through the inspection process, support for newly qualified teachers and for head teachers. Funding also provides for adviser work on promoting effective assessment of pupil performance, support for improvements in teaching and learning and raising standards of achievement in literacy, numeracy and information and communications technology (ICT). The Advisory Service also provides leadership and development in Early Years education and supports the monitoring of policy in SEN, Health and Safety and carries out surveys on the quality of educational provision in Norfolk.

The Service provides a comprehensive and high quality programme of continuing professional development for teachers and managers in Norfolk schools across all phases. Courses are provided at the Professional Development Centres in Norwich and King's Lynn, as well as in school and at local conference locations across Norfolk.

A significant part of the support provided to headteachers and their schools has to be accessed on a bought in basis from funding delegated to the schools or through funding within the Standards Fund. This is done through the packages set out in the LEA's Services to Schools booklet or through individual contracts for advice, training or consultancy.

The Advisory Service also manages the successful Governor Support Service, which provides advice and training for Norfolk's school governors. The work of this Service continues to depend on funding through the Standards Fund on an annual basis.

In addition the Advisory Services include the County's Sport Development Team, the Environmental Education Service (including Holt and Wells Field Study Centre) and the Norfolk Music Education Service.




