## Independent Learning Day at Thorpe

As a lead practitioner for the SSAT, I led a seminar with the theme of Independent Learning in the RE classroom on 26<sup>th</sup> November at Thorpe St Andrew School.

We looked at generic themes and ideas for our students to consider how to get the best out of them and how to embed independent learning in our classrooms and departments. Greg Dewar shared some of the ICT ideas he has for Norfolk too. (Thank you Greg!). It was a successful day, for me not just because it was fun to share something I enjoy doing but also because I learnt a lot from other teachers.

The hope is that this term (time allowing as always) this group goes for a "Learning Visit" to a place of worship outside of the area and begins to develop a bank of resources for all RE teachers to use on the Internet. And the way forward? It would be great to continue with this group of teachers and other RE teachers in Norfolk and beyond to share ideas and good practice. With the use of email (or blogging?) it can be a fairly painless and less time consuming process!

I hope to work for the SSAT next year and be able to offer more INSET in this way which is good value for money and gives another area of support for professionals who often feel isolated.
