Venue: Professional Development Centre, Woodside Road, Norwich Hocus and Lotus, the Dinocrocs, is an innovative and very exciting development in language teaching forchildren aged from 3 to 8 years old. It is supported by over 10 years of research into how young children acquire a language and accompanied by excellent multi-lingual resources to support the non-specialist teacher. During this session, led by Joan Dickie, we will aim to cover a small amount of theory, practise learning a story and see video footage of the resource used in local schools. Even if, at present, you only teach KS2, this is a fascinating resource with relevance to KS2 methodology.
