Sonica Spanish: an exciting new software package for teaching and learning Spanish, commissioned by the DfES for teachers with basic or no grasp of Spanish. Featured recently on BBC Newsround, Look East, TES and The Guardian.

Sonica has been trialled this year in 4 Norfolk schools. The software is highly interactive, with (more than 240) activities designed for listening, speaking, reading and writing that push the boundaries of kinaesthetic learning. These include a dancemat, interactive games, assessment units and karaoke-style activities. Sonica Spanish has been developed with the National Languages Strategy in mind. It includes 12 units that are closely aligned to the QCA guidance on teaching Spanish to KS2 and it includes links to the Language Ladder.

Alan Thompson (Dereham, St. Nicholas Junior) and Jill Holt (Avenue Middle) will be demonstrating the resource, talking about how they are using it in the classroom and letting us have a go!
