Val Malcolm

Val Malcolm has been the headteacher of Withins School in Bolton for just over four years. It is a 'School facing Challenging Circumstances'. In each of the measured standards regarding attainment and attitudes she has led her school from severe negative trends into positive trends. The Ofsted report 2002 stated 'The headteacher provides clear educational direction and is persistent in driving the school forward to overcoming the difficulties it faces'. This success followed her team effort to raise standards when she was a deputy headteacher at another school which was recognised by the HMCI as one of the most improved schools in the country in 1998.

In the past three years at Withins, a Social Inclusion Development Centre has been set up. It started as a project using SRB funding and due to its success has been developed further. Its success has created interest from HMI and it has been visited on three occasions by members of the team. It is now being used by the LEA and others as an example of how BEST teams and Inclusion Centres could be shaped in other schools.

Val lives in Blackburn with her husband and three children. She begins a new Headship in September 2003.

Val will be talking about the challenges she faced as a Head, and what initiatives she created in particular relating to Alternative Curriculum.
