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
# Welcome to this issue of Training News extra

# Early Years Foundation Stage

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) will become the mandatory framework to support children's learning and development from birth to the end of the foundation stage, from September 2008.

The overarching aim of the Early Years Foundation Stage is to help children achieve the Every Child Matters outcomes of staying safe, being healthy, enjoying and achieving, making a positive contribution, and achieving economic well-being by: setting the standards, providing for equality of opportunity, creating the framework for partnership working, improving quality and consistency and laying a secure foundation for future learning.

# Putting the Early Years Foundation Stage into Practice

This training will enable participants to explore the principles of the EYFS and commitments in more detail.

The course will equip participants with an approach and process for exploring the pack with practical hands-on activities with support and input from the trainer.

The training will also provide opportunities to look at the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework as a tool to reflect on current practice and to use as a resource for developing practice.

Please note: If you have requested EYFS training in your setting you do not need to apply for the above course.

# Welcoming EAL children and families into Early Years Settings

These sessions will offer practitioners the opportunity to reflect upon the needs of bi-lingual children in Early Years settings, and to increase confidence and expertise in this area. They will be led by an experienced Early Years specialist from the English Language Support Service, and the course aims to increase an awareness of good practice for EAL children. There will be opportunity for wide-ranging discussion, covering issues such as, integrating new arrivals into your setting, developing the language of EAL children, awareness of cultural differences, the procedures for use of interpreters, and translation services, together with a chance to view resources. # CACHE Level 3 Diploma in Home-based Childcare

This is a new course for Home-based childcare practitioners and an updated qualification for childminders.

The course comprises of 5 units, although 1 unit would have already been covered if you are a registered childminder, as this is a requirement of registration.

### Unit 1: Introduction to Childcare Practice assessed through a multiple choice question paper.

The following 4 units will be delivered on a unit by unit basis, through taught sessions every 2 - 3 weeks. There will be a requirement to spend a minimum of 2 hours every week as home study. Each unit is assessed by way of an assignment, which relates directly to your day to day practice.

# Unit 2: Childcare and Child Development (0-16) in the Home-based Setting includes:

- Promoting children's rights
- Working with disabled children and their families
- Children's development and well-being

### Unit 3: The Childcare Practitioner in the Home-based setting includes:

- The reflective practitioner
- Assertiveness and valuing yourself
- Marketing your childcare service
- Policy writing
- Interagency working and other professionals
- Child protection
- Continuing Professional Development

### Unit 4: Working in Partnership with Parents in the Home-based Setting includes:

- The childcare practitioner and the community
- Families, culture
- Promoting positive relationships with parents or other primary carer
- Confidentiality, data protection and the law
- Contracts and complaints
- Communication with the child's primary carer

# Unit 5: Planning to Meet the Child's Individual Learning Needs in the Home-based Setting includes:

- The planning cycle
- Rationale for and methods of child observation and assessment
- Interpretation and evaluation of observations
- Using observation and assessment to inform planning
- Monitoring and evaluation of the planning cycle

# Common Assessment Framework

This course aims to allow participants to increase their knowledge and understanding of the principles of effective information sharing and the Common Assessment Framework, and to implement these into their day to day practice.

**Learning Outcomes:** By the end of the course participants should:

- Have increased their knowledge of the government agenda for Information Sharing and Common Assessment (ISA) in relation to the five key outcomes of Every Child Matters
- Have gained information about other agencies working in their geographical area
- Increased their understanding about the importance of Information Sharing and the legal framework within which they need to operate
- Understand the format of the Common Assessment Framework and when to complete one
- Have gained an understanding of the role of the Lead Professional
- Know how to complete a Common Assessment

**Target Group:** Multi-agency staff who work with children and young people aged 0 - 18 years.

# Courses/Training offered by Children's Services Sensory Support

All the training/courses below can either be tailored to individual settings or delivered on a cluster/area basis depending on need.

# Signalong Courses 2008

Signalong is a sign support system based on British Sign Language vocabulary and concepts. Its target users are people with learning difficulties who need a visual and largely iconic (pictorial) support system for spoken English. It is a key word system: it is intended that Signalong signs are used at the language level of the 'client', helping to add meaning to the most important spoken word or words in a sentence.

We will run both Foundation Courses and Introductory Sessions over the year. All courses will be led by a trained Signalong instructor and are designed for parents and carers of, or people working with youngsters or adults who use signing as part of their total communication system, or to support communication.

The Foundation course takes ten, 90 minute (or seven, 2 hour) sessions to complete. It covers the history and philosophy of Signalong, hand formations, sign movements and directions and a basic selection of vocabulary relevant for the target users, using one of the vocabulary manuals published by Signalong. These are expected to run after school hours in the Autumn Term at Harford Manor school and in the Spring Term at Hall School, Old Catton.

Introductory Sessions can be tailored to individual needs, in time, location and some specific content.

# Sensory Awareness Training

A basic introductory session would cover the follow elements:

- Knowledge of different conditions and their effects
- Deaf awareness and sight loss awareness
- Communication approaches used in Norfolk
- Empathy exercises
- Knowledge of different technology available to support children and settings
- A friendly environment for deaf and visually impaired children



# British Sign Language

## The following courses are available;

British Sign Language NVQ Level 1 - this will run from September through to July and can be offered on an area basis.

Family Signing Curriculum - this can be tailored to individual settings or cluster needs and has been piloted in Norfolk for the National Deaf Children's Society.

# Cochlear Implant Conference - 29th April, 2008

The Newborn Hearing Screening Programme means that every baby born is given a hearing test in the first few hours/days of life. Many babies who are diagnosed are given the opportunity of a cochlear implant. This conference will be relevant to any setting that has a deaf child and for those professionals who want to get a basic awareness of deafness, the effects of deafness on the child and the latest technological advances and methods available.

# **Downs Syndrome**

We are able to offer training to settings specifically around individual children who have Down Syndrome and a visual or hearing loss. This training would be free of charge and tailored to the needs of the child and setting.

# Sensory rooms

An introductory session to the basic principles and methods for using sensory rooms with young people with sensory impairments. This session may include ideas for how sensory equipment may be used in different settings, or be tailored to look at specific equipment within a particular setting.

# Cued Speech OCN Level 1 and Level 2

Cued Speech uses eight handshapes in four positions around the mouth to represent all the speech sounds. This system helps deaf children to lip-read more accurately. Cued Speech is easy to learn and fluency comes with practice. It gives access to both speech and environmental sounds. It also supports the learning of reading.
