The judges will be members of the Spring Fling organising committee and the scarecrows will be judged on the afternoon of Tuesday 5th April

How to enter

- 1 Fill in the form to let us know that you are entering a scarecrow these must be returned to us by the morning of Monday 4th April
- 2 Bring your scarecrow to the Norfolk Showground (Exhibition Hall) at one of these times

Tues 22nd March between 3.30 and 5.00 Wed 23rd March between 3.30 and 5.00 Tues 5th April between 10.00 and 12.00

We are only able to accept scarecrows at these times. The exhibition area will be signposted

The Spring Fling 2005 Scarecrow Challenge Rules

Make a scarecrow using only recycled materials

The scarecrow must stand up by itself on a concrete floor

It mustn't be any bigger than 1.5 meters tall and 1.5 meters wide

Each scarecrow must be labelled (on the back) with the name(s) and age of the maker(s) and an address or a contact telephone number

All scarecrows must be removed from the showground at the end of Spring Fling.
Any remaining after 5.00 pm will be destroyed
