Contrasting habitats

Investigate mini beasts, under logs or in tall grasses. Use field equipment, care for the creatures, identify and compare distribution.



The life of plants

Meet a plant and look closely at it's parts. Search for flowers and discover how they vary. Play games to understand pollination and seed dispersal. Investigate the effect of soil on plant distribution.



Living together

Trail to find out about the inter-relationships between living things. Games to introduce the importance of plants in photosynthesis and food chains.



Pond life

Explore the adaptations of pond creatures to their environment. Look at how they can be classified and at their life cycles.



Meetings with trees

Discover the distinctive nature of a woodland habitat, examine a tree and take measurements to describe it.



Wildlife explorer

Using sight, hearing, smell and touch to experience the wildlife of a meadow.
