The Competition

The **Eastern Daily Press** and Bayer CropScience (Norwich) are launching a schools poetry competition for pupils aged 8 to 11 years to reach its climax on National Poetry Day (October 6, 2005). Taking its cue from National Poetry Day, the theme of the competition is 'The Future'.

There are two age categories:
1) 8 and 9-year-olds
2) 10 and 11-year-olds
(age as at closing date).

The idea is to challenge children to think creatively about the future –

anything from sci-fi to what they might be eating for tea.


The winner of each age category will receive £100, plus a day out at Norwich City Football Club. Each of their schools will receive £500, plus the opportunity for six school-nominated pupils to spend a day at the Norwich City Study Support Centre.

Rules

■ The competition is open to pupils aged 8-11 in the EDP's circulation area.

■ It will be judged in two categories:
1) 8 and 9-year-olds
2) 10 and 11-year-olds
(age as at the closing date).

■ Each poem should be on the theme of 'The Future' but can have its own title. It must be the poet's own work.

■ Poems can be of any length up to 40

lines (not including title) and should be written or typed on A4.

■ Each poem should have the poet's name, age and school on the back.

■ Entries will be read by the first stage judges who will select a shortlist for final judging by Stephen Fry and Raffaella Barker. The judges' decision is final.

■ The closing date for entries is July 15, 2005. All entries should be submitted via

the school and cannot be returned.

■ The two winners will be notified in early September via the schools and winners will be announced in the EDP in the autumn.

■ Winning poems – and a selection of others – will be published in the EDP and on the Web.

■ Normal Archant Regional competition rules apply.
