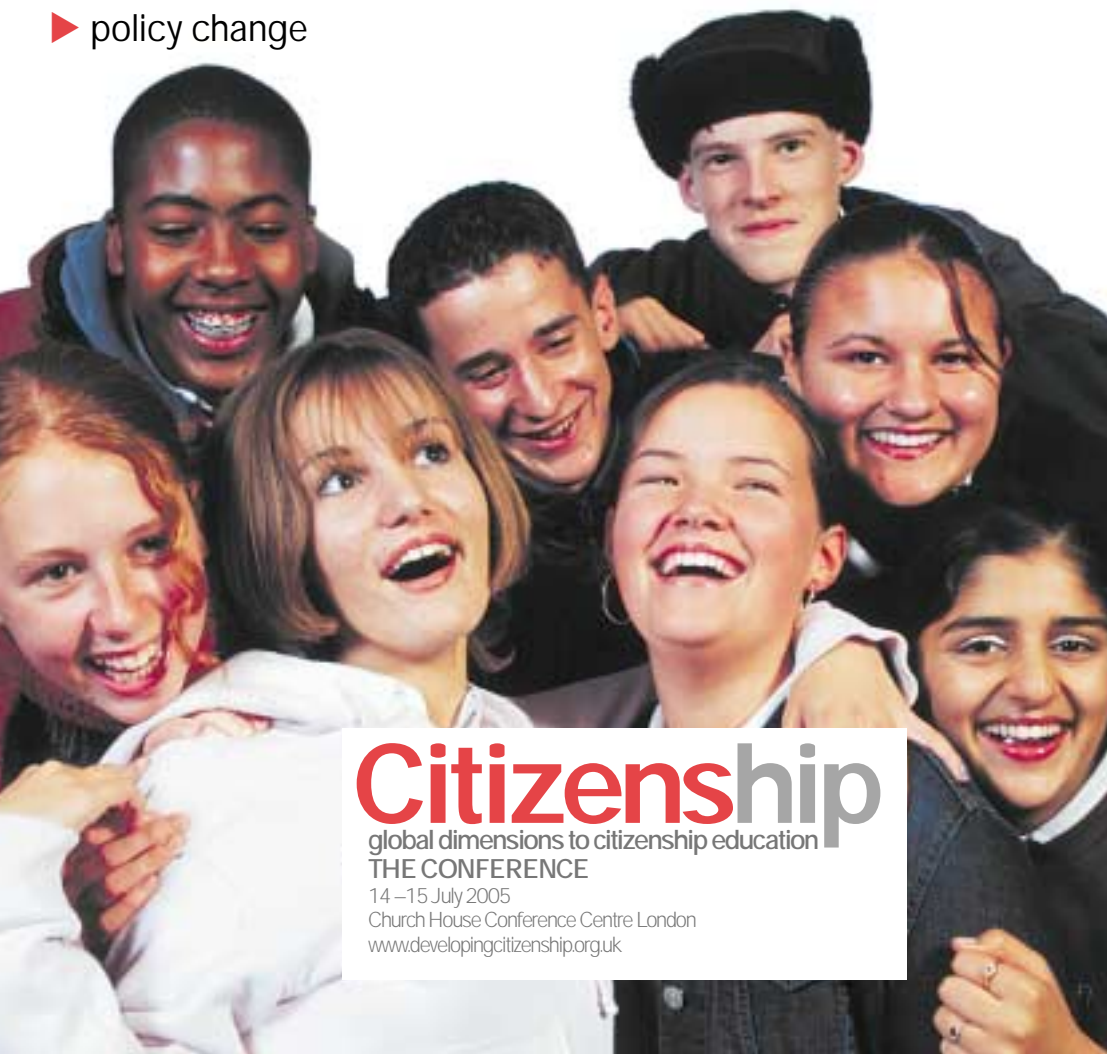

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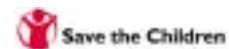

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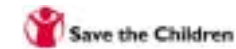
THE CONFERENCE

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How do we provide secondary students with
positive experiences of citizenship?



The challenge

Young people are growing up in a globalised society that increasingly affects their lives. How can we provide them with relevant understanding, skills, values and positive experiences of citizenship?

Citizenship

is part of the Developing Citizenship project, launched in 2002. The project was initiated by Oxfam, Save the Children and Unicef for secondary schools to address the challenge, and to create practical ideas for their students. Developing Citizenship is supported by education advisers, Development Education Centres and the Department for International Development. **www.developingcitizenship.org.uk** gives examples from project schools.

The conference is for

- ▶ secondary school teachers and ITE tutors
- ▶ education advisers, inspectors and development education workers
- ▶ school managers and policy makers

It will

- ▶ share ideas and experiences from project participants
- ▶ enable conference participants to develop and discuss their ideas on the role of citizenship education in a changing and globalised society

Explore

the contributions of a global dimension to:

- ▶ young people's experiences of local, national, and global citizenship
- ▶ young people's motivation and achievement
- ▶ teachers' professional development
- ▶ the school community

Apply

a global dimension to:

- ▶ the citizenship curriculum
- ▶ student participation in school and local community
- ▶ school policy and ethos development

The format

- ▶ workshops, seminars and discussions facilitated by Developing Citizenship project participants: teachers, advisers, and development education workers
- ▶ presentations by educators and policy makers: opinions, suggestions, dilemmas and prospects for citizenship education with a global dimension

Thursday 14 July 10.30 – 18.30 **Friday 15 July** 10.00 – 16.30
