Globalisation

"I believe we are still growing in Norwich" – Shaun Meadows, Director of Customer Service (Projects) at Norwich Union.

"We have the opportunity for further sustainable expansion here and for Norwich to become an even greater centre for the financial industry," concluded Shaun Meadows, at a recent lecture on globalisation and its impact on the local financial industry. The joint event was run by the Norwich Centres of the Institute of Financial Services and the Chartered Insurance Institute at the Assembly House, Norwich.

The first speaker, global sourcing expert Kevin Duffy, who is Principal Consultant at Winchester White, explained that globalisation has been with us since Roman times and the influx into Norwich of Flemish weavers in the middle ages was just one example of this.

Both speakers agreed that the challenge facing employers and employees alike was staff upskilling and life long learning. Describing a system of "train/do, train/do", Kevin said that in future employers would have a portfolio of jobs and would seek training in different fields throughout their career.

Shaun Meadows also envisaged that higher level skills would be needed locally. He referred to the unique programmes at the FIG School of Financial Services at City College which give access to upskilling opportunities to all and which provide employers with direct influence on the education of the future workforce. He said he believed that Norwich was already taking the right steps to prepare for the future.



I found the recent lecture on globalisation and the financial industry (page one) both thought-provoking and rather sobering. The potential impact of globalisation on the sector can unquestionably be a daunting prospect for anyone concerned with the prosperity of the region, including current and prospective employees and support businesses.

Successful financial businesses, however, have always evolved to make the most of current opportunities and it makes no sense for the local industry to curb its business success by not taking advantage of the global marketplace.

As the lecture demonstrated, globalisation always brings opportunities and the important thing is to identify future opportunities and make the most of them.

The county is already coming up with solutions to support companies' evolution and some are highlighted in this magazine.

For example, we are already encouraging young people to get involved with industry through initiatives like the Exchange's Stock Market Challenge (see page 6). Programmes like this encourage into the industry dynamic, enthusiastic talent - people who offer new perspectives on a changing business. Globalisation itself makes the industry more exciting and attractive to join as it further accelerates changes in the way we do business.

Norfolk is also well ahead of the field in developing managers of the future. The Financial Services Foundation Degree at the School of Financial Services, the first of its kind in the UK, means employers are tailoring the education and skills of their staff even before they graduate. This means employers are directly influencing the education of their workforce so that it can meet the future needs of the business. 

Free Training for Norfolk Insurance Firms

Norfolk insurance firms looking to recruit and train new entrants now have access to a new flexible apprenticeship scheme at City College. The Advanced Modern Apprenticeship in Insurance is designed to offer a basis of vocational skills and knowledge relevant to the insurance industry.

The NVQ Level 3 qualification offers a choice of pathways and units. The apprentice can follow one of three NVQ paths in Insurance General & Intermediaries or Customer Service or Administration, with a mix of units relevant to the workplace and also studies for the Certificate in Insurance. The General Insurance framework can be delivered on a half day release basis and the scheme is funded for apprentices up to the age of 22, so all training is free.

The report covers the full scope of CSR activity in 2004, ranging from significant successes within our environment programme and the implementation of CSR measures for reporting on workforce issues, to further promotion of CSR best practice among our suppliers worldwide.

Norwich Union Insurance (NUI) has been particularly proactive on the CSR front across eight policy areas, which

include customers, health and safety, suppliers and human rights. One of the key successes in 2004 was the roll out of Norwich Union's Leadership and Care initiative across the which resulted significant improvements in customer satisfaction particularly within the call centre environment. Another highlight was the relationship between Business in the (BITC) Community and Union's Norwich business.solutions department has developed into an award winning partnership with business.solutions receiving the East of England Regional Volunteer Team of the Year award. The Norwich Union Pay As You Drive (PAYD) insurance pilot was also launched to excellent reviews in 2004. This is a revolutionary new way of selling car insurance based on how often the vehicle is used. This innovative new structure of generating premiums will truly reflect individual driver needs as well as having a knock on effect on

the environment by increasing drivers awareness of how often they are using their vehicles.

2004 saw NUI support the local community in various ways such as encouraging employees to support local community initiatives. One initiative is the mentoring scheme where staff support community groups, students and head teachers in schools. NUI sponsors the school trails at the Royal Norfolk Show. Over 4000 school children from around Norfolk take part

in the trails, where they get information on topics such as nature, woodlands and farming. NUI is also providing the insurance free of charge for The New Youth Venture in Norwich, which is due to open next year. The aim of this is to create a youth centre for young people aged from 12 to 30 from the Norwich area, which will incorporate youth charity and action groups to educate and advise young people. NUI also helps to tackle real issues in communities such as the fight against crime. For example, in the Norwich area we sponsor a security hardening scheme with the local police for homeowners

who have been burgled, as well sponsoring Neighbourhood Watch coordinator. NUI also currently sponsors the Canaries for the Community scheme Norwich City Football Club (NCFC). This brings together two strong brands in the local community which committed to investing in the community. Again, this initiative enables staff, along with NCFC fans, to help with two community projects per year.

With climate change being high on the political agenda recently, NUI has helped to reduce the impact made on environment by aiming to reduce waste and increase recycling. During 2004 NUI introduced a number of paper saving initiatives such as reducing the paper weight on product literature introducing duplex printing, which reduces the number of pages printed. This resulted in 100 tonnes being saved by NUI. General waste management was

promoted by "On The Up", which was NUI's vehicle in 2004 for driving environmental initiatives. It included tips and actions for saving energy such as switching off lights, lamps and monitors.

Going forward in 2005 NUI will remain committed to integrating CSR into our business in a way that positively impacts the business, the environment and the community, in which we live and work.
