Teachers and helpers go free of charge.



HOW TO FIND THE POPPY LINE



Sheringham Station is by a large public pay-and-display car park, just off the A149 at the entrance to the town. From the A148 Comer — Holt road, follow the Sheringham and brown railway signs on to the A1082. Sheringham's 'one' railway station (Bittern Line trains from Norwich) is just across the road from the Poppy Line.

Weybourne Station is south-east of the village. Follow the signs from the village centre on A1459, or from Bodham on A148.

Holt Station is just off the A148 east of Holt at High Kelling.

All stations have level access, and there is wheelchair access to trains. Please advise us if you plan to include any disabled persons in your party.

THE EVACUEES

Supporting National Curriculum History key stages 1 & 2

In the dark days at the beginning of World War II, the Government organised the mass evacuation of children from areas under major enemy threat. In this dramatic re-creation of the event, children are taken by steam train to an unknown destination, where the Billeting Officer

desperately tries to arrange accommodation. While they wait at the station, local Women's Institute ladies keep them occupied by demonstrating "make do and mend" and showing them how to cope with rationing; and a friendly Air Raid Warden shows them how to survive in air raids. The siren goes,

and the crump of bombs is heard in the distance...
