Leading from the Middle is a three-term professional development programme for middle leaders in primary, secondary and special schools.

It is aimed at teachers who are beginning to take on management and leadership responsibilities including subject leaders, subject co-ordinators, heads of year/house, pastoral co-ordinators, SENCOs. The programme is designed for a 'Learning Set' from each school, consisting of between 2-4 participants and a leadership coach.

Research-based and developed by teachers for teachers, the programme is a blended learning experience consisting of:

- A School Leadership Project which allows participants to apply new expertise in their school
- The Virtual School a computer-simulated school in which teachers can experiment with new ideas
- Online communities where participants can extend learning, share ideas and access peer support.
- Online learning-centred leadership materials these web based resources offer access to essential training and development tools
- > **Development days** face to face training days focusing on the acquisition of skills with colleagues from other schools

The programme is based on self-directed learning, so participants can spend as much time as they wish using the materials. All participants are expected to attend 3 full development days, 2 twilight events and approximately 20 hours online tasks.
