Professor Jardine's comments about the lecture - In his classic work, THE IMAGINARY MUSEUM, André Malraux wrote that 'we forget that museums have imposed on the viewer an absolutely new relationship with respect to the work of art'. In the 1950s his emphasis on the transforming power of the museum proposed a radically altered context for understanding the importance of art and artifacts in all of our lives. In my lecture I will argue that at the beginning of the twenty-first century Malraux's original insights enable us constructively to reassess the relationship between the modern museum and its diverse audiences.

Many 'mathematical phenomena' find application and sometimes spectacular physical illustration in the physics of light. Concepts such as fractals, catastrophe theory, knots, elementary calculus, infinity, zero, and even when 1+1 fails to equal 2, are needed to understand rainbows, twinkling starlight, sparkling seas, oriental magic mirrors, and simple experiments on interference, polarization and focusing. The style of the lecture is intellectual but nontechnical, and the presentation is based on pictures.
