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The module aims:

To enable teachers to support the learning needs of pupils who have Multi Sensory Impairment (MSI in this context refers to pupils who have multi-sensory impairment and complex needs).

Opportunities will be provided for students:

- To develop an understanding of definitions of MSI and how typical child development may be affected by multi-sensory impairment
- To have an overview of relevant modes of communication for pupils who have multi-sensory impairment
- To understand how specific theory and practice may be used as a basis for working with pupils who have multi-sensory impairment
- To understand what needs to be assessed and why, when working with a child with MSI
- To understand the roles of the other individuals involved with the child who has MSI including different models of collaborative working
- These modules can count towards a post graduate award (Certificate, Diploma or Masters Degree)

The module will involve eight taught days, four school based training days (supported by a mentor) and school/institution based research
