In 1998 David Hargreaves and Donald McIntyre met with a group of secondary school heads and discussed ideas such as the knowledge creating school. Out of this was born the Schools University Partnership in Educational Research. This partnership has engaged in developing and supporting educational research and enquiry undertaken by practitioners and university-based colleagues. It has also been researched and now written-up into a forthcoming book called *Researching Schools*. The conference will explore what has been learned, how it works, what the future of this area looks like and what are the key ideas and practices.
