EGYPTIAN FOLK DANCE

This popular workshop covers hands-on experience with authentic Egyptian musical instruments and costumes and an introduction to traditional Egyptian Folk Dance.

Participants make connections with Ancient and Modern Egypt, learning about the Goddess of music & dance, Hathor, whilst dancing to genuine Egyptian rhythms.



AFRICAN DANCE

Learn some basic African dance movements and gain hands-on experience with many instruments, particularly the powerful African drum called Djembe! If you are focusing in a specific African Country just ask for details. *Plus Caribbean, Reggae & Samba.*

HAKA



The whole body should speak particularly the face - using symbolic face paints.

Learn the true meaning of the Maori Haka

ANCIENT BRITONS

Decorate your face like an Iceni Warrior. Honour Andraste, as Boudicca did, dance to Celtic Rhythms.



GREEK DANCE

If you are studying the Ancient Greeks, learn the Geranos spiral dance depicting Theseus entering the labyrinth. The workshop covers many Greek instruments and finishes with a very fast and exciting modern Greek dance.

INDIAN DANCE

Honour Shiva, Lord of the Dance by learning Indian Dance movements to classical Indian music, the result of which is the ability to weave individual stories through dance and mime. Try tabla, flute, finger cymbals and ankle bells, or dance Bollywood.

The workshops are cross curricular covering music and dance within PE, History, Music, R.E., Geography, PSHE and possibilities for follow up work in English, and Art. There are also opportunities for sharing work at the end of each workshop.

AZTEC DANCE

Music & dance were very important to the Aztecs.

Huey Tecuilhuitl festival in month eight, was dedicated to Xilonen - the young Goddess of the Green Corn. Wearing symbolic face paint, learn about Aztec instruments and dance to the Goddess Xilonen in ancient Aztec style. Try out the instruments also. Plus Peruvian Shaman Dance or Bold Samba Carnival.



NATIVE AMERICAN OR ABORIGINAL DANCE

The dances connect to Mother Earth and the cycle of the seasons or imitate wild and revered animals. Native American dance and Australian Aboriginal dance have many connecting facets. Try the Didgeridoo or the magnificent Buffalo drum.

ROMANS

Learn to dance like the Romans did, to well researched ancient Roman Music.
