created replicas and interactive exhibits have also been made for the children to get 'hands on' with. Fully trained activity leaders will conduct the sessions in the Museum galleries and education rooms.



CHRISTCHURCH MANSION

TOYSTORY Key Stage 1 1 hour 15 minutes

Spin the 100 year old Zoetrope and compare modern and old toys. A giant jigsaw puzzle timeline helps children see the changes in toys and childhood over the last 150 years. The children bring their own toys from home to compare with the toys in our galleries. Find out

RUFFS and STUFF Key Stage 2 2 hours

In the Tudor chambers of the Mansion children unlock the mysteries of Tudor life using actual Tudor objects and portraits, learning how the lives of the rich and poor were very different. Replica costumes (including a 'Bumroll'!) can be tried on by four

children. The children become portrait detectives and unlock the secrets of the Tudor portraits.

WHAT ELSE IS THERE TO DO?




Ipswich Museum is a Victorian built museum with extensive collections of Ethnography, Mammals, and Geology. There are also reconstructed Anglo Saxon and Roman domestic settings, the Ipswich story from pre-historic times to the present day, a special exhibition on Ipswich at War and displays of Egyptology from the famous Petrie collection.

Christchurch Mansion and Park

are an oasis in the heart of Ipswich. The house was built in 1551 and is laid out in period room settings from the Tudor times to Victorian, within which artefacts, costume and textiles are displayed. There is also a large collection of paintings including many from local painters such as Gainsborough and Constable as well as many Tudor



portraits. Also there is the very rare Painted Closet, a tiny room panelled with dozens of pictures of fables and mythical creatures, painted in the sixteenth century.
