



New – for Religious Education at UEA – a course designed in partnership with the Keswick Hall RE Centre, and with local authority RE advisers:

**'RE-Developing':
Subject Knowledge,
Understanding,
and Leadership
in Religious Education**

Who is the course for? Qualified specialist teachers of RE in primary, secondary and special schools; qualified teachers with other specialisms who teach RE; other recognised and qualified educators in schools, Higher Education, local authorities, and in other education networks.

What are the course aims?

For teachers and educators to develop their subject knowledge, understanding and leadership in RE, in order to contribute to the learning and professional development of their students and colleagues.

What is it about? Subject knowledge and understanding (SKU) about religion, religions and RE pedagogies; RE leadership skills.

Who will teach it? The lead tutor is Linda Rudge, Director of Keswick Hall RE Centre at UEA. Other associate members of the RE Centre and local authority colleagues will contribute to the programme.

Is it accredited? This course runs as a unit within UEA's Masters in Advanced Educational Practice (MAEP) OR colleagues can enrol as delegates on a short course option for in-service training purposes. For successful candidates on the MA, the award is 60 credits at postgraduate level on completion of a series of assessed tasks.

When does it take place? 60 hours of group contact (plus tutorial support and assignments for those enrolled on the MAEP) during ten half day or twilight sessions of four hours each, and one residential weekend (20 hours) between late October 2006 to June 2007. The deadline for the final assignment at MAEP level is August 31st 2007.

Where does it take place?

Most of the course will take place at the UEA campus in Norwich, beginning Tuesday October 31st with a session from 4.30 till 8.30 pm.

Cost: £1,060 to entrants at Masters level OR £600 for delegates on the short course option.
