

## FOODAID'06 GETS KIDS RAISING MONEY TO COMBAT WORLD HUNGER

International aid agency Concern Worldwide is delighted to announce that over 1,500 schools have registered to take part in FoodAid'06, their annual fundraising campaign that aims to get schools raising money to help provide poor communities around the world with innovative solutions to overcome hunger and poverty.

Many schools have been busy fundraising in recent weeks to coincide with their harvest activities or World Food Day on October 16<sup>th</sup>. A huge thank you goes out to all schools that have already sent your money in as over £66,000 has been received to date, which is fantastic news. The money raised will help poor people gain better access to a regular supply of nutritious food through a number of initiatives. These include providing families with tools and training to grow drought resistant crops and with small livestock, such as goats and chickens, whose produce can be consumed or sold at market. These initiatives may sound simple but they really can make all the difference.

Emmanuel Kumudya and his family in Malawi are one of many families that have benefited from Concern's food programmes recently. Emmanuel explains, "I feel so grateful to be part of this programme, it has enabled me to grow enough food for me and my family through a period which we would have otherwise found very difficult. I cannot overestimate how important it has been to us."
