

Head for the Future

Head for the Future is a new headteacher development programme from NCSL that builds on and replaces the successful Leadership Programme for Serving Headteachers (LPSH).

HTI is a member of the Hay Group Consortium of providers for Head for the Future and is responsible for delivering this programme in your local authority.

What is the programme about?

Head for the Future, designed collaboratively between NCSL and the Hay Group, retains all the best elements of LPSH – the feedback and diagnostics, the practical models of leadership and the debate with other heads.

The new programme has been developed to directly tackle the emerging challenges facing headship, particularly the need to collaborate with other schools and agencies. The increasing variety of different models of schools each with its own ethos and set of challenges places new demands on their leaders. Head for the Future asks each participant to challenge their own perceptions about the change and outcomes they require, keeping a clear view of what their particular context demands.

How will it affect me?

This new programme is a fast paced and challenging blend of feedback, stimulating debate, demanding reflection and commitment to action. It is an honest mirror of your impact on others and will help shape your leadership for years to come.

Because there is a focus on how you help others to grow and to take initiative, the programme represents an investment in your school's capacity as well as your own.

Head for the Future is highly relevant and accessible to all headteachers provided they have three years or more experience as a Head. Past LPSH participants are therefore welcome to apply.

What does it cost?

This programme includes leadership diagnostics, a three day residential, in-school development and a final one day workshop. The school contribution for Head for the Future is £750 per participant starting the programme before September 2007.
