#### **Summary**

The purpose of this course is to familiarise participants with autism and various approaches to working with people with autism and their families. Structured Teaching, Division TEACCH's main intervention approach will be emphasised and participants will see how it has evolved in response to the unique needs of the autistic population. Aspects of applying TEACCH techniques to classroom instruction will be highlighted. Over the three days, the programme will also discuss diagnosis and assessment in autism demonstrating the instruments developed by Division TEACCH for these purposes.

Places are limited to one per school. Schools must have an identified need and applications must be endorsed by the school's Area Service Manager for Inclusion, previously Pupil Entitlement Support Officer (PESO).
