Photography & Darkroom Workshops

A one-day workshop in one of the following techniques:

Digital Photography - Learn the basics of using a digital camera including menu functions, resolution, controlling lighting, transferring images to computer and modifying them, printing or saving onto CD.

Photoshop For Photographers – Use Photoshop to optimise your scanned in, or downloaded photographs. Useful photographers techniques are covered, such as soft focus, motion blur, panoramic images etc.

Black and White Darkroom Printing – Learn how to take photographs, process the film, make contact sheets and create prints in the darkroom. An exciting process where the potential for creative control can be seen at all stages in the making of a photograph.

Pin-hole Photography – A low-tech and fun way to make beautifully atmospheric photographs without a camera. Old-school methods that put you back in touch with the wonders of light and image-making.

The black and white darkroom comprises of six enlargers with facilities to print from 35mm to Wideformat, a high end print and negative dryer. all chemicals, papers and films needed for workshops.

ONE-DAY WORKSHOPS

Based on digital and traditional arts techniques, these workshops can be tailored to suit students from 11+ or teachers and educational workers who wish to train to use the techniques in their schools and organisations.



Video Filming & Editing Workshops

A one-day workshop in one of the following techniques:

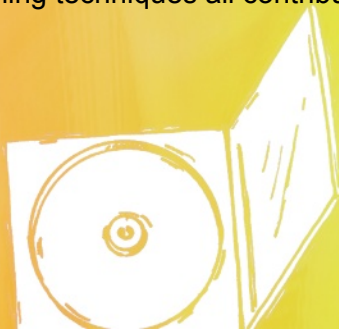
Traditional Video – Learn the basics of filming including understanding your video camera, lighting, choosing shots, handling movement, sound, storyboarding etc.

Music Video – Create a dynamic music video (play live or mime to a track) learning about aspects of production such as controlling lighting, choosing shots, building style, handling sound as you go.

3 Minute Shakespeare Video – Dramatise and film a famous scene from a Shakespeare play using projections, sound and alternative filming techniques to help tell the story.

News Report Video – Use contemporary news programme techniques to tell the story of a current (or historical) issue. Motion graphics, sub titles, sound and dynamic filming techniques all contribute to the final newsreel.

Video Editing, Effects or Sound Workshops

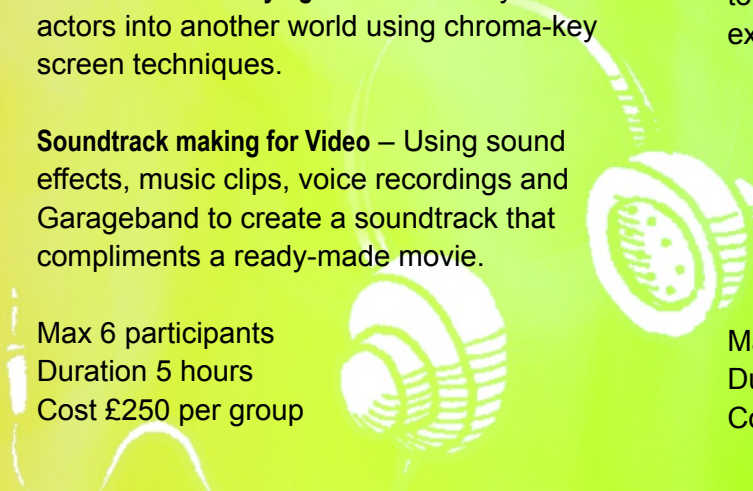
All film footage is provided for these one day workshops in the following techniques:

Video Editing with iMovie – Learn the basics of putting a film together with cuts, transitions, titles and sound, using this easy to learn editing programme.

Creative Chroma-keying Video – Place your actors into another world using chroma-key screen techniques.

Soundtrack making for Video – Using sound effects, music clips, voice recordings and Garageband to create a soundtrack that compliments a ready-made movie.

Digital Arts Workshop

A one-day workshop in one of the following techniques:

Image Manipulation with Photoshop – Through a series of enjoyable exercises, learn how to use Photoshop to alter reality and produce photographic illusions.

Beginners Website Creation – Learn the basics of creating a simple website using iWeb and then publish it live to the internet (no previous website creation experience needed).

Intermediate Website Creation - Learn how to use Photoshop and iWeb together to create a fully customised website that reflects your topic or interests. (previous Photoshop experience recommended).
