# A record 6,867 School Children visited the 2007 Royal Norfolk Show

1,983 school children attended the 2007 Show on the Wednesday and 4,884 on Thursday. Entry prices, trails and exhibits at the show are the same for both days.

School parties enjoy a discounted entry rate of £3.00 per school child these fees can be reclaimed by returning completed trails. To be eligible for a refund one individual trail per child must to be completed; children may complete more than one trail if they wish. Trails available for Key stages 1, 2 and 3. Look out for ticket application forms at the start of the spring term.

As part of the Year of Food and Farming a separate competition is being launched this year for Primary Schools. The same principals will apply with the judging taking place in March and the winner displaying their work at the Royal Norfolk Show on the 25 & 26 June 2008.

# Schools Poetry Competition 2008



The 2007 competition attracted 497 entries from 12 schools. Pupils from the following schools were awarded prizes:

This competition is intended to give children the opportunity to study their local environment and write *a poem which reflects the Countryside, Food or Farming* of the East Anglia Region. Poems will be judged on their suitability for an audience, including title, ideas expressed in the text, and poetic form.

This gives children the opportunity to study the work of professional artists and then, for the children to produce a piece of art on any aspect of British Food, Farming or the Countryside, in the style of their chosen artist. *Alternatively children may use their own style*, without reference to the existing work of any professional artists.

Poetry & Art Competitions – First Prize in each year group category wins £100 for the School and £30 for the child.

Runners-up in each category win £75 for the School and £10 for the child.

The closing date for entries is 20 March 2008.
