

CAR PARKING

There is limited pay and display ticketed parking available adjacent to The Courtyard off Penhaligon Way. Car parking enforcement is in operation. Please ensure you park within a designated bay and display a valid ticket (reduced rate permit is available when booking delegate place – please see delegates rates section of this form).

There is further public pay and display parking available a couple of minutes walk away from The Courtyard at Merton Meadow car park, behind the football ground.

Please respect the venue's neighbours and do not park in adjacent residential areas.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Local Buses

Bus services including the 72 to Bobblestock, 492 to Leominster and the 38 from Ross-on-Wye, stop just outside The Courtyard. Full details of the bus company schedules can be found online <u>HERE</u>

Trains

Hereford railway station is approximately a fifteen-minute walk from The Courtyard. There is a taxi rank situated at the station.
