We are planning a strong media presence across the country, both regionally and nationally, with the endorsement and support of the Prime Minister and other senior government ministers, along with well-known names in the arts and creative industries. We hope - with your support - to be able to promote to the media a wide array of celebratory events covering a multitude of talents every day of the festival week.

We can support you with a creative kit which your staff and students can tailor-make to suit their needs including posters, stencils, badges, certificates, jingles and screen-savers. We will also provide a PR pack to help you promote your events to your local media and in the community.

Your students can play an active part in the national programme too by contributing to the Shine web site www.shineweek.co.uk which will be a platform to showcase young peoples' talents through film, stills, stories, quotes and more - a virtual wall of talent.

There will be an exciting buzz around Shine, which coincides with the new National School Sports Week, which was announced just two weeks ago and championed by Dame Kelly Holmes. So if your school is joining in National School Sports Week you can choose to combine all your activities under one celebratory banner.

The vision for the festival is to give every young person a chance to shine. We hope you will energise your staff and pupils to showcase all that they have achieved this year. This is an invitation for teachers and students to start thinking about how they could participate in Shine, how they could create ways to express their talents and spot the talent in others.
