ROYAL NORFOLK SHOW 2002

This year British Transport Police will be attending the Royal Norfolk Show, with a major theme highlighting Route Crime. Route crimes are incidents which occur on or close to the railway, and they frequently lead to injuries, fatalities, and damage to the infrastructure. Overall, the crimes committed by individuals break down into three main categories, namely:

- placing small objects on the line to see the effect of a train running over it;
- throwing stones at trains; and,
- using the railway as a short cut.

Such crimes can cause a very serious danger, not only to those committing them, but also to police, railstaff, and passengers. They also cause delays to rail services, leading to associated problems beyond the area of the incident.

One of the main issues for us to address is the fact that route crimes greatly increase during the school holidays throughout the year. The long daylight hours, combined with school children having more free time tend to be contributory factors to this situation.

In order to try and reduce such serious incidents, British Transport Police is launching a number of initatives, including attendance at the Royal Norfolk Show in conjunction with our rail industry partners. During the event, we will be aiming to highlight the issues relating to route crime and one way will be a schools related competetion. Full details of the competition are contained in the enclosed sheet, and I would therefore very much welcome any help you could give us in promoting it to your staff and pupils.
