Tea and Talks 2008 at Colchester Castle

Jade Suits and Clay Soldiers - Burials of the Han Imperial Family Saturday 18th October

Dr Lukas Nickel, Lecturer in Chinese Archaeology

Department of Art and Archaeology, School of Oriental and African Studies, and Institute of Archaeology, University College London.

During the Western Han Period (206 BC to 9 AD), shortly after the First Emperor unified China, the country was ruled by the Liu family. Coming from a modest social background, many of its members intended to raise their prestige by building tombs of extraordinary size and filling them with treasures and every-day objects. The talk will investigate the funeral practices and ideas of the Han imperial elite and compare these with archaeological evidence from tombs of common people.

The Cutty Sark – China Tea and the Ships it Created Saturday 25th October

This presentation will begin with an introduction to the Cutty Sark before recounting how tea became a part of everyday life in Britain and the American Colonies before the fight for independence began with the Boston Tea Party, and how that event ultimately triggered a major change in the design of merchant ships used to carry tea.
