For the afternoon we will arrange a variety of activities from the period. Thus your pupils may be sending each other signals in Morse code, logging short wave radio programmes, taking part in a Beetle Drive, or even drawing up the schedules for The Home Service. They will be working in groups on average of 8 to 10.

The day is aimed at Year 6 Keystage 2, and up to 100 pupils can be accommodated.

We arrive at 8.30, and after setting up, will be ready to start at 10.00. The morning's activities take about 90 minutes, and the afternoon a little more, although the timing here is more flexible.


