## Roots of Norfolk at Gressenhall – What's on for your school?

If you are looking for a really worthwhile educational visit the **Norfolk Rural Life Museum** may provide the solution. We offer a safe site in beautiful unspoilt Norfolk countryside. Collections of rural and Norfolk life are housed in workhouse buildings dating back to



1777. There is a traditional farm worked by heavy horses with rare breeds of farm animals.

The new workhouse experience is a moving insight into the world of the workhouse and the people who lived there. Step back to the 1930s in Cherry Tree Cottage, our village shop, post office, seed merchants and forge.
