"I remember the rations, clothing coupons, having to wait in long queues at the butchers, and being so pleased if you could get luxuries - like biscuits. Some families were quite poor and sold clothing and sweet coupons for extra money."

"Rugs were made out of old coats etc. Hairpieces were made from cellophane paper, as well as belts. My aunt made her stair carpet out of large balls of string. Fish net scarves were the fashion - my mother was a fisherman's daughter so knew how to make them."

Summer Activities

The Paul Hamlyn Foundation awarded the Lynn Museums £2000 to embark on a series of children's activities to be held in rural areas in the West Norfolk area. The grant allowed children who live at a distance from the museum the opportunity to see artefacts and learn more about their local history.

This was delivered through a series of arts based workshops held in village halls over the school summer holidays. These workshops were delivered by local people and were co-ordinated by people from within the Villages, and Millennium Volunteers supplied helpers.
