

Origins is an important and relevant resource for schools, covering a number of specific aspects of the National Curriculum.

The attraction spans 3 floors and takes the visitor on an interactive, 2000-year journey through history exploring the impact various waves of settlers and invaders have had on the language, landscape, culture and people of the eastern region.

The age range able to make most direct use of the installations and displays would be 8-14 years old, although there are some specific aspects which would be relevant for older pupils.

- Origins aims to
 - Present the eastern region's connections with the wider world by showing the diversity of people who have come to it through the ages. Links to:

<u>History</u>

Arrival of settlers from the Romans through Anglo Saxons, Vikings and Normans

- Relevant to the History curriculum for Key Stage 2
- Good range of opportunities for pupils to investigate aspects of each wave of settlers
- The emphasis on interpreting objects is particularly useful for allowing pupils to undertake a historical enquiry from a range of sources of information, as required in the National Curriculum History Programme of Study

• Arrival of the Normans with emphasis on Castle buildings and the role of Church

- Appropriate for **Year 7 pupils** (11-12 year olds) in Middle or High Schools
- Relevance to the "Britain 1066-1500" study units in the KS3 programme of study

• The Modern World after 1900

- Pupils in Key Stage 3, Year 9 (13-14 year olds) will find the display on United States of America Air Force relevant
- This section will also be of interest to primary schools who study "Britain since 1930" or to GCSE students seeking an introduction to an historical enquiry into the East Anglian airfields during 2nd World War

180° film show

 The film is an appropriate way for pupils to gain an historical overview of Norfolk

Geography

- A sense of place that defines Norfolk
 - Allows pupils in Key Stage 2 (7-11 year olds) to answer questions such as "What is our landscape like?"
 - For Key Stage 3 pupils (11-14 year olds) the emphasis on how man has shaped the physical landscape in Norfolk will give them the opportunity to address geographical questions, such as "How and why is our landscape changing?" and "What is the impact of these changes?"

• Environmental Education

- Installations and displays focus on the valuable habitats of the Norfolk region and land management issues affecting Norfolk today
- Relevance to issues on **sustainable development** in the Geography curriculum and aspects of Citizenship
- For older pupils there are opportunities for more complex interactions via the multi-media stations, which would also allow individuals or pairs to investigate aspects of the North Norfolk coast further
