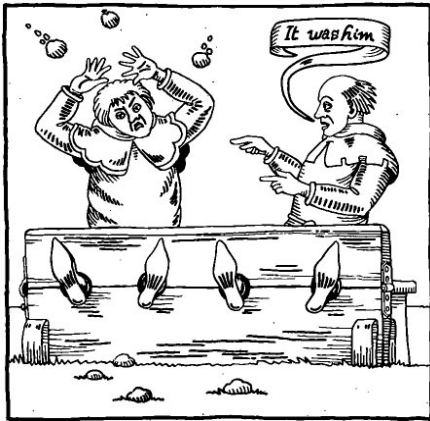


What's on for schools at Great Yarmouth Museums



Spend Time in the Cells

Visit the newly redisplayed Tolhouse, find out what life was like in a Victorian prison, and see how this compares with the experience of modern day inmates.

Find out how witches were treated in the seventeenth century and see what Napoleonic prisoners of war did in their spare time.

Meet the Victorians

Meet William Shuckford the Tolhouse Jailor to discover the harsh realities of life in a Victorian prison. Learn about the life and crimes of local inmates and the punishments they received for their misdemeanours.

Meet Robert Blake the Butler at the Elizabethan House museum, and find out about life above and below stairs in a middle class Victorian household. Find out about the duties of the servants and handle the labour saving gadgets that they would have used to help them with their daily chores.

Meet Billy "Bumble" Baxter the Fisherman and find out about life on an early steam drifter. Handle objects used by local fishermen. Hear tales of life at sea and learn all about Scotch girls, superstitions, and silver darlings.

These sessions can be booked individually or in any combination.

Explore the Elizabethan House museum

Visit the Elizabethan House museum to explore the home lives of the Tudors and Victorians. There is much to see and touch within this museum and we offer schools a variety of guided tours and hands on sessions with original artefacts. All our sessions are designed to support the *National Curriculum* and can be tailored to suit your needs. Popular sessions include:

Charges: Until 1st April 2003 the admission charge for school groups will be £1.00 per child (85p each for NCC schools). Schools with 25% of their students receiving free school meals will be admitted FREE OF CHARGE.
