'Sick of Smoking?' Participation in No Smoking Day: March 12th 2003

No Smoking Day is an important part of our commitment to reduce the number of children and young people and families who take up smoking or use tobacco and cigarettes.

Participation in No Smoking Day will provide the school community with an opportunity to reinforce messages already presented by the Healthy Schools initiatives particularly around maintaining good health and overall drug awareness and education. Nicotine in tobacco is the most available drug children and young people can use and, to which, they can and will become addicted.

'Sick of Smoking?' came as a direct quote, often given by smokers as their reason for quitting. Often people cannot pin down one reason, and 'sick of smoking' sums up the many personal reasons people have for wanting to stop smoking. People are sick of the smell, the frustration, of feeling ill, of spending money, of all the negative feelings smoker have about their habit - No Smoking Day sums it up by asking if they are 'Sick of Smoking?

Messages

The three main messages of the No Smoking Day campaign are that if you are sick of smoking then, No Smoking Day is a good opportunity to stop, smokers can get help when they want to stop, there are health and other benefits to stopping smoking.

What your school can do!

- 1. Your school could put up a poster and leave out information leaflets in a prominent position in busy reception areas or school corridors.
- 2. Members of the school community could develop a table top or free standing display on smoking issues and helping people to quit
- 3. The school could plan and deliver a focused No Smoking Day event or activity on or near the 12th March 2003.
