The whole Conference will be an opportunity for training and professional development, exchanging ideas, and sharing practice. Seminar reports will include classroom-focused topics from teachers, and workshops will also provide a practical focus to many of the sessions.

## Subject leadership - qualifications and in-service training:

The new 'Leading RE' course will begin in April 2003. Designed for subject leaders in primary and secondary schools, this course is available as an accredited option under the UEA Masters programme, or as non-award bearing in-service training.
