Moore: The Graphics | 19 April - 18 June

In Association with The Henry Moore Foundation

A visit made to Wingfield by The Henry Moore Foundation inspired this exhibition, which opens the first tour in over 20 years of Henry Moore's graphics.

Traditionally known for his sculpture, this celebrated artist was also fascinated by printmaking processes. These exceptional examples of his graphic and drawing skills span 50 years.

Selected from over 6000 prints held at The Henry Moore Foundation in Perry Green, Hertfordshire, the exhibition includes some of Moore's earliest graphics, including woodblock prints, etchings, collographs and lithographs.



Henri Matisse: Jazz | 31 May - 29 June

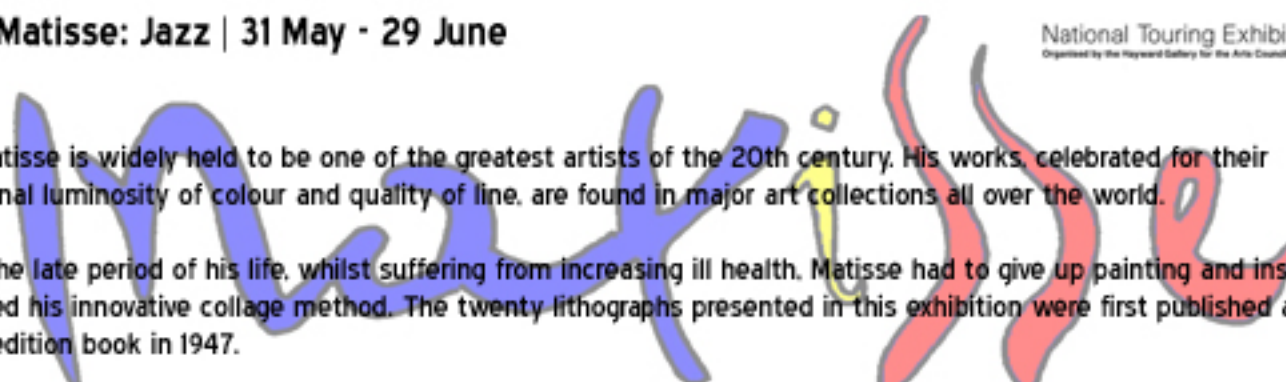
National Touring Exhibitions

Henri Matisse is widely held to be one of the greatest artists of the 20th century. His works, celebrated for their exceptional luminosity of colour and quality of line, are found in major art collections all over the world.

During the late period of his life, whilst suffering from increasing ill health, Matisse had to give up painting and instead developed his innovative collage method. The twenty lithographs presented in this exhibition were first published as a limited edition book in 1947.



Graphic Suffolk: Graphic works by artists from all over Suffolk. 24 May - 6 July

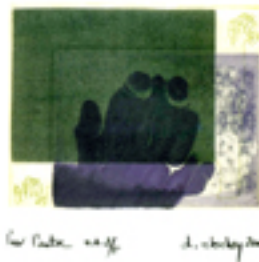
This exhibition of drawings has been specially put together by Suffolk Open Studios to reflect the variety of work produced in the county. A fascinating array of works on paper by artists who may normally paint, sculpt, weave, throw, carve, decorate, dye, print, digitalise or create in other media.

The exhibition is part of Suffolk Open Studios 2003, when over 300 artists open their studios throughout the weekends of June.



Cadaqués Mini Print International 24 May - 10 August

Organised in Cadaqués near Barcelona this touring exhibition includes over 500 mini-masterpieces by 60 artists from over 70 different countries.



Lee Miller: Portraits from a Life | 21 June - 28 September

One of the outstanding photographers of the 20th century. This exhibition of Lee Miller's portraits and other artists' portraits of her, reveal her friends and subjects in stunning images that include many of the most brilliant artists and writers in the Europe of the thirties, forties and fifties.
