## COMMUNITY FIRE SAFETY COMPETITION 2003

Following last year's success in attracting a good response from schools in the county to participate in a Community Fire Safety competition, Norfolk Fire Service intend to run a similar event this year.

The aim of this competition is to encourage children to consider Fire Safety within their normal curricular activities at the start of the new term.

The theme for this year has been drawn from National Community Fire Safety initiatives and will be:-

### FIRE SAFETY IN THE COMMUNITY

***Year Five pupils from your school are invited to enter this competition to design a school magazine based on Fire Safety in the Community which gives information, advice and ideas (using written articles, drawings, plans & sketches) on how to prevent a fire in the community (at home, at school etc) and the steps to take in the event of a fire.***

The competition entries will be judged by the Norfolk Deputy Chief Fire Officer.

The school of the winning entry will receive a cheque for £100 with the pupil responsible for the entry receiving a book token and a smoke alarm for the home. A presentation of these prizes will be made during the Norfolk Fire Service Awards Evening on the 31st October 2003.

### DETAILS OF ENTRY

**Magazine format** - Two A4 sheets of paper or one A3 sheet folded

Competition restricted to YR5

**Magazine content** - Anything relating to fire safety/prevention in the community (at home, at school etc). The magazine can contain written articles, drawings, plans, quizzes and so on to make it as interesting and informative as possible.

**Entries by October 10th** (winner will be notified no later than October 17th)

The school supporting the winning entry will receive a cheque for £100 with the pupil responsible for the School Magazine receiving a book token and a smoke detector for the family home.

A presentation of these prizes will be made during the Norfolk Fire Service Awards Evening on the 31<sup>st</sup> October 2003.
