/ Dragons in Norwich

Dragons have been a heraldic symbol closely associated with the city of Norwich since the Middle Ages. Today dragons are still visible across the city's architecture and feature in many city celebrations.

The Norwich Education Network (a networking group for local education providers) initiated the idea of a festival to celebrate the enduring importance of dragons in the culture and history of the city.
