Professional Development Placements offer a unique opportunity to explore the links between business and education.

Lecturers

They are open to both teaching and non-teaching staff in all schools and colleges across the county, and many other education professionals.

### What is a Professional Development Placement?

It's when teachers or school support staff spend time with local businesses or commercial organisations as a form of professional development.

#### Who are placements aimed at?

Placements are aimed at teachers, teaching assistants and all support staff in Nursery, Primary and Secondary schools in Norfolk. They are also suitable for FE or Sixth Form college lecturers, school governors, those working in Special Needs and those involved with careers guidance and advice.

(For simplicity, all those eligible for placements are referred to as 'teachers' throughout this document).

#### Can you describe a typical placement?

There's no such thing as a typical placement - they will all vary in their aims, objectives and duration. They are entirely flexible and can be arranged at a time that is most convenient for all those involved.

Placements can last anything from half a day to five days, but they can be longer and are sometimes spread over a number of weeks or months. They can be tailored, negotiated programmes for individuals or jointly planned for larger groups spending a day together with a host company.

#### So what's the point of a placement?

"If pupils are to be prepared appropriately for working life, it is essential that teachers have up-to-date knowledge of the world of work, and are aware of the opportunities the curriculum provides for this preparation." Qualifications & Curriculum Authority, 2000

Placements help to create a better understanding and strengthen partnerships between schools in Norfolk and business, industry and the wider community - such collaboration can have mutual benefits for teachers, schools and also host companies.

# What are the benefits to teachers and schools?

If you're a teacher, placements offer you a valuable opportunity to enhance your understanding of business and industry, help to improve your management skills, update your specialist subject knowledge or create curriculum resource materials modelled on your host company.

For schools, a placement is a highly flexible, cost-effective form of professional development for your staff (placements are free but supply cost is not included). They can be used in many different ways to develop the knowledge and skills of your staff so that targets for pupil achievement set out in your School Development Plan can be met.

Links established with local businesses can be strengthened by follow-up activities such as school visits, presentations or work experience placements for pupils. Employees from your host organisation may even wish to become involved with your school on a long-term basis as mentors or governors.

# What are the benefits to employers?

You will be able to encourage a greater understanding in schools about the world of work and give teachers an insight into your needs as a business. You will gain valuable information about the world of education and also find out about new qualifications.

Building links with local schools will also enhance your profile within the local community, and also presents excellent development and training opportunities for your staff.

# Here's some examples of placements run in Norfolk in the past:

- To increase pupil and teacher motivation and raise aspiration in science, maths and technology, eight Secondary teachers spent a week at NASA's Kennedy Space Centre in Florida, working alongside rocket scientists, engineers and astronauts
- Ipswich & Norwich Co-op Society have run very popular training days for Primary and Secondary teachers based on Enterprise and Citizenship through co-operative learning
- Six Primary teachers and two Maths advisers got together to devise 'Maths Counts' - a series of maths games which were developed and put into context following a one-day placement at Sainsbury's
  - Norwich Union played host to teachers of PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education), offering a valuable insight into their recruitment and interviewing process and helping teachers to review interview skills delivery and enhance their knowledge of employability for 14-16 year olds
- A Head of Food Technology at a Secondary school participated in a placement at The Lavender House restaurant owned by a nationally-renowned chef to enhance her pupils' understanding of life in a working restaurant





## How is the Professional Development Placements programme funded?

The project is managed by Norfolk Careers Services and is supported and funded by the Norfolk Education Business Exchange Ltd and the Norfolk Learning and Skills Council.
