#### PRIMARY SCHOOLS EVENTS:

**CINELITERACY WORKSHOP featuring JAMES and the GIANT PEACH (U).** *Key Stage 1 Literacy.* The hour will be spent in developing pupils' ability to read the moving image using a selection of clips and shorts. **BFI INSETS FOR PRIMARY TEACHERS:** We are pleased to be able to offer the following INSETs in collaboration with the British Film Institute:

**STARTING STORIES: FRIDAY 27TH FEB**. This INSET will offer teachers in Early Years and Primary settings (3-7-year-olds) a rationale for working with films as texts to develop language and literacy skills in the classroom.

#### STORY SHORTS: MONDAY 15TH MARCH.

This INSET offers Key Stage 2 (7-11 year olds) primary teachers a rationale for working with moving images in the class-room to promote the development of literacy skills. It will show how short films can be used effectively to support speaking, listening, reading and writing, for example, by focusing on character, narrative and setting.

Fee: £60 per INSET per person. Both INSETs run from 1pm – 4pm and will include light refreshments. You will also receive a copy of the relevant resource pack, comprising an illustrated teaching pack plus VHS video, as part of the course fee.
