## Murder, Mystery and DNA in the Garden

The exhibition, organised by the Norwich Research Park celebrates the 50th anniversary of the discovery of DNA structure and looks at what the next 50 years of scientific endeavour could bring.

The DNA in the Garden exhibition – which has already visited Kew Gardens and the Eden Project – shows how the molecule that connects all living things on earth, from the tiniest microbe to the largest blue whale, is also responsible for the huge variety of plants found around the world today. The exhibition, by the BBSRC and the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, is presented by the John Innes Centre, the Institute of Food Research, the University of East Anglia, the Teacher Scientist Network and the BBSRC. It will remain open throughout National Science Week at the Forum, 12-23 March 2004.
