On behalf of the trustees of AWTF and the Project Steering Group I would like to invite you to attend the launch of DoughUK.com. at "OPEN" the Norwich Youth venue at 2pm on Wednesday 2nd June 2004.

DoughUK.com is a web-based resource which allows young people to explore their knowledge of personal finance. The site contains examples, activities, information and signposting, allowing young people to dip-in to the resource for specific aspects of finance (for example, banking, budgeting etc.) relevant to them. The resource will also be available in CD-rom format.

The resource has been developed by a multi-agency steering group with support from AWTF. Young people themselves have been heavily involved in the development and trialing of the materials.

Refreshments will then be provided, with an opportunity to try the materials for yourself! Our guests will also receive a copy of the current CD-rom version of the materials.

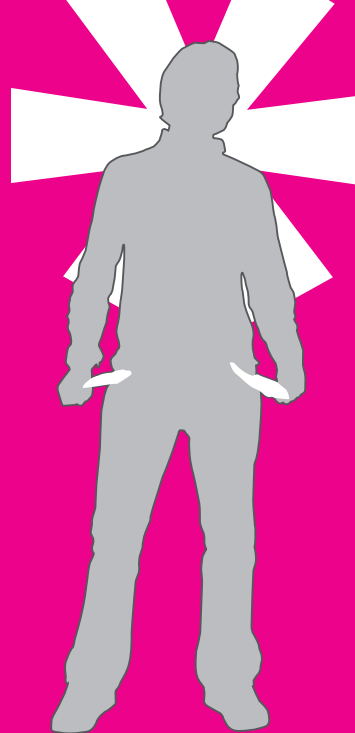

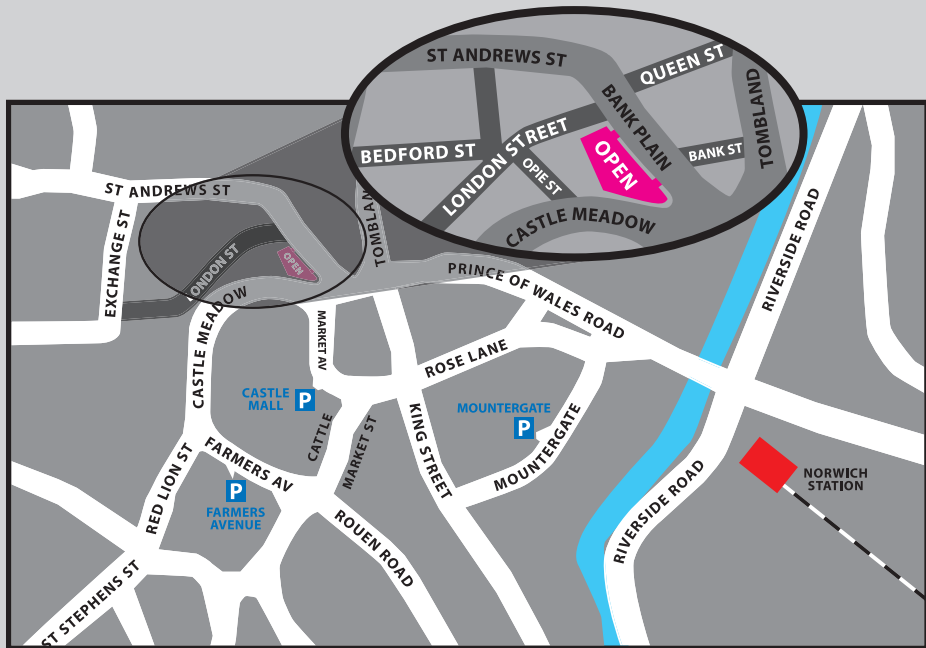
