

ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2005

1. INTRODUCTION

This document outlines the second set of proposed changes to admission arrangements following the Education Act 2002, the 2003 School Admissions Code of Practice and revised admissions regulations. It details the LEA proposals on admission arrangements for 2005 for Community and Voluntary Controlled schools and introduces a proposed co-ordination scheme for primary schools. A response form is attached to enable all schools to respond to the LEA proposals.

A web page is available so that schools can respond electronically. The address is given below. Foundation and VA schools are also required to consult on their admission arrangements. The DfES has recently written to the LEA stressing that all Norfolk VA and foundation schools must correctly consult, determine and notify of their 2005 admission arrangements. A copy of the DfES' letter, outlining the correct procedure, can be found on the LEA's admissions web page. This web page will also allow Foundation and VA schools to comply with DfES' requirements by enabling them to publicise and notify of their admission arrangements electronically. Schools wishing to do this, should e-mail their consultation document and a response form to helen.bates@norfolk.gov.uk

The consultation on published admission numbers has been undertaken separately. Schools should receive this and the admission number consultations at around the same time. Responses on proposed admission numbers are required by 1st March 2004.

2. LEA PROPOSED CHANGES TO ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2005 (See also separate LEA consultation on admission numbers for September 2005)

Following consultation in Spring 2003, the authority has introduced coordinated admissions for the September 2004 transfer to high schools. This process is now under way. The 2002 Education Act also required local education authorities to introduce primary school co-ordinated admissions from September 2005.

2.1 Primary School Co-ordination for September 2005

It is proposed that the same co-ordination scheme implemented for high school transfers from September 2004, be adopted for admissions and transfers to primary schools in September 2005. The only difference is that for primary school admissions and transfers there is no requirement to co-ordinate the process with neighbouring local education authorities. It is proposed that:

- the scheme will offer parents the right to express up to three preferences for all first admissions and junior/middle school transfers;
- a common application form will be used with all preferences sent back to the authority at County Hall. We will then forward details of preferences to foundation and voluntary aided schools so that governors at these schools can apply their admission arrangements and advise the authority of their decisions;
- the authority will then make all offers of places for all Norfolk primary schools including voluntary aided and foundation schools at a set date.

A proposed timetable is attached. This includes a significant change in the first admission timetable to allow sufficient time for the new co-ordination process to be undertaken. This should enable the authority to advise first admission schools of numbers at an earlier stage. This co-ordinated process provides an opportunity for all schools to adopt a common approach to first admissions. Foundation and VA schools, in consulting on their proposed admission arrangements are therefore asked to give consideration to aligning their first admission policy to that adopted by the vast majority of schools in Norfolk, ie:

- those born 1st September to 28th/29th February admitted full-time from September;
- those born 1st March to 31st August admitted part-time in September and full-time from January.

2.2 Secondary co-ordination scheme for 2005

The authority is proposing a minor change to the internal timetable by requesting foundation and VA schools to advise the authority of their admission decisions two weeks earlier than proposed for the 2004 round. This additional time is required as the authority will have to co-ordinate with neighbouring authorities in 2005.

2.3 Minor change to oversubscription rules – Feeder schools

The authority continues to review its arrangements each year. We are now considering a minor change to our oversubscription criteria for community and voluntary controlled schools, which will enable more children to transfer with their peers as they progress through the school system. Children living outside a school catchment area will continue to have a lower priority than those living within it, and those with siblings will continue to have a higher priority than those without. It is proposed that for those children living outside the catchment area, highest priority will continue to be given to those with siblings. The next priority will be given to those who attend a feeder school. Any further offer of places will be determined by distance.

APPENDIX C

NORFOLK SCHOOLS CO-ORDINATION OF ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS SEPTEMBER 2005

1. Summary

- The Norfolk scheme will commence for the secondary transfer round in September 2004 and for the primary admission and transfer rounds in September 2005.
- Parents must be offered the opportunity to express three preferences.
- Parents will be required to complete a common application form that must be returned direct to the LEA.
- Any parent seeking to apply direct to a Foundation or Voluntary Aided school must be provided with a common application form inviting three preferences which must then be forwarded to the LEA.
- Closing date for applications will be on the date set out on the proposed timetables.
- Foundation and Voluntary Aided schools who manage their own admissions and who are over-subscribed will be forwarded details of all preferences cast for their school to enable them to apply their over-subscription rules.
- Parents will be advised to complete a supplementary application form or forward appropriate additional information as required by those Foundation and Voluntary Aided schools who require additional information to apply their rules.
- Foundation and VA schools must return all applications sorted in rank order to the LEA by the date set out on the proposed timetables,(see timetable for further details for heavily over-subscribed schools).
- The LEA will operate the co-ordination scheme to ensure the offer of one place only.
- Where more than one place could potentially be offered, a single offer will be made for the school the parent ranked highest on the common application form.
- The LEA will send out offers of school places for **all** Norfolk schools by first class post on the offer date set out on the proposed timetables. This will advise parents of their right to appeal and to whom their appeal should be lodged for each preference which is refused.

- Where no preference can be met, the LEA will allocate a place at the next • nearest school with spaces to ensure an offer is made to all parents living in Norfolk.
- The LEA will maintain a waiting list until the end of the Summer Term 2005 • for all Norfolk schools to co-ordinate any changes which occur after the offer date.
- The scheme details how late applications will be dealt with, in accordance with recommendations in the 2003 Admissions Code of Practice.
