The objectives of this course are:

- making judgements about standards of attainment at end of Foundation Stage and KS1
- making a judgement about progress between Foundation Stage and KS1 for Self Evaluation
- interpreting Key Data on Foundation Stage and KS1
- judging prior attainment using the Foundation Stage Profile
- to go beyond the RAISEonline full report and explore the interactive online capabilities
 - to identify the impact on Average Point Score and Contextualised Attainment of individuals and groups of children
 - to create and use the additional school defined pupil characteristics to enhance filtering capabilities
- to use data to provide evidence to support school self-evaluation

This course will involve both hands-on analysis of school's own data and an opportunity to reflect on your own self-evaluation of attainment and progress.
